### Welcome from the Head Teacher

Dear parents, carers and friends of Stanton Vale,

Welcome to the third half termly newsletter of this academic year. This half term has seen the return of students going out and about into the local and wider community. In school we have seen an increase in Forest School activities and there is now a weekly Forest School club which is really well attended.

Trips to West Park and local supermarkets and cafes strengthen the Independent Learning in the curriculum and affords opportunities for functional Literacy and Numeracy activities. Students in Elm class have also been visiting Lea Green an outdoor activity centre near Matlock once a week. Activities include accessibility bikes, a nature treasure trail and making popcorn and toasting marshmallows over a camp fire. The students really love it. After Easter it will be Oak classes turn to venture out.

Willow class participated in a Table Cricket tournament and I am delighted to say that the school only lost once but won two matches, so well done to all the students involved for doing so well. At Stanton Vale, we have undertaken a huge journey in developing a phonics scheme that supports all of our students in their communication and language development. For some students, this may be reading and writing, for others this may be listening and responding or communicating a choice. However it looks for individual students; we have made it our mission to ensure all of our students are given the opportunity and support to develop their reading and communication. The school have invested in the Jolly Phonics scheme and are currently embedding this into some of our classrooms. So far, the results have been amazing and we are so proud of all of our students accessing this and continuing to develop their reading and writing ability. With the help of Nell, our new caretaker, we have created a reading room that will house all our new interventions. It is a welcoming and calming space to learn and once it is completely finished, I will be sure to add pictures to the website! On the whole, I am incredibly excited about where we are on our journey and I am excited for the next part which will involve interventions, creative teaching and fostering a love of reading around the school!
